ORDINANCE 2152

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE ACCEPTANCE OF A TRAFFIC SIGNAL AT THE INTERSECTION OF WOODLAND AVENUE AND OAK TREE ROAD (RT. 604) IN THE BOROUGH OF SOUTH PLAINFIELD COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Borough Council of the Borough of South Plainfield, County of Middlesex, State of New Jersey as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** That the intersection of Woodland Avenue and Oak Tree Road (Rt. 604) shall be controlled by a Traffic Control Signal in accordance with the As-Built Traffic Signal Plan Dated July 2019 and Timing Directive bearing the date of October 9, 2017.
- **SECTION 2.** That the Traffic Control Signal shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices, Title 39 of the Revised Statutes AND the New Jersey Administrative Code, and shall be operated in conformance with the designated plans.
- **SECTION 3**. That all prior ordinances and/or resolutions or portions thereof of the Borough of South Plainfield Council inconsistent herewith be and they are hereby repealed.
- **SECTION 4.** That this ordinance shall become effective upon adoption and publication as required by law.
- **SECTION 5.** That if any clause, section or provision of this ordinance is declared invalid by a Court of competent jurisdiction, such provision shall by deemed a separate distinct and independent provision and shall not affect the validity of the remaining portion hereof.
- **SECTION 6.** When the ordinance is finally adopted, the Borough Clerk will send a certified copy of the same to Ronald Sendner, Acting Middlesex County Engineer, PO Box 871, 75 Bayard Street, 5th Floor, New Brunswick, NJ 08901 for submission to the Middlesex County Board of Chosen Freeholders for a Consenting Resolution.
- **SECTION 7.** Any section of any other Borough rule, regulation, policy, ordinance or requirement that conflicts with any part of this Ordinance is repealed to the extent of the conflict.
- **SECTION 8.** If any chapter, section, subchapter or paragraph of this Ordinance be declared unconstitutional, invalid, or inoperative, in whole or in part, by a court of competent jurisdiction, such chapter, section, subchapter, or paragraph shall to the extent that it is not held unconstitutional, invalid, or inoperative remain in full force and effect and shall not affect the remainder of this Ordinance.
 - **SECTION 9.** This Ordinance shall take effect immediately or as required by law.
